

BRIAN FAULKNER

Brian has worked in over 250 veterinary practices as a clinician, consultant and confidence coach. Noel Fitzpatick is a pioneering Irish neuro-orthopaedic veterinary surgeon. He currently operates a veterinary referral center of some 100 employees, called Fitzpatrick Referrals, Surrey, England, with state of the art orthopaedic procedures.
