James Navé is a poet, performer, facilitator, and founder of The Imaginative Storm Creativity Salon. He co-founded The Artist's Way Creativity Camp in Taos, New Mexico with Julia Cameron and currently facilitates Artist's Way creativity classes in New York City. He has memorized 500 plus poems and has presented Imaginative Storm poetry performances and writing workshops in North America, Europe, South America, Asia, and Africa.
