## Abstract (200 Words):

The session offers undergraduate and graduate students and postdoctoral fellows the opportunity to hear specific examples of several non-academic career paths, as well as a general discussion of the breadth of possibilities that exist beyond academia. The session will provide general information, advice and interactions with participants and peers to share questions and ideas.
