How do I participate in Global Youth Service Day?

Get started by picking your GYSD project! Whether you're joining an existing project, or starting your very own project, YSA has the ideas, tips, and project planning resources to help you on your way.

How can my school/organization participate?

Whether organizing a service project or a celebration event, there are so many ways to be involved in Global Youth Service Day. Schools and organizations may work with young people to start their own project, or sponsor or join an existing project. Projects can be as simple as a "Thank You" picnic celebrating your organization's young people, or large-scale and service-focused, such as a city-wide clean-up or a town "fun run" to raise money for a charity.

YSA offers grants to youth, schools, and organizations to fund GYSD and other service and service-learning projects. Grants are already distributed for GYSD 2016, but sign-up for email updates to receive news of upcoming grant opportunities.

Where does Global Youth Service Day take place?

GYSD is celebrated each April in more than 100 countries across six continents. We encourage people to plan projects in their local communities to create real, lasting impact.

Who organizes Global Youth Service Day?

Global Youth Service Day is a campaign of <u>YSA (Youth Service America)</u>, but it's made possible by young people and <u>partner organizations</u> around the world. Through Global Youth Service Day and other year-round programs, YSA calls on young people to serve, and provides youth and their adult mentors with funding, tips, tools, and training to lead high-quality, high-impact volunteer projects.
