

Steps to Design a Volunteer Economic Opportunity Program

Use this worksheet to begin planning for your volunteer economic opportunity program. This worksheet will help you identify the type of program you want to offer, and determine some of the key program elements needed to create an impactful program.

STEP 1: NEEDS ASSESSMENT

If you are interested in creating a new economic opportunity program, or would like to offer new services through an existing program, start with an initial needs assessment to help you identify which services would be most impactful for your community. If you currently offer an economic opportunity program but are exploring how to utilize volunteers in service delivery, skip ahead to **STEP 4**.

STEP 3: FINANCIAL CAPABILITY SERVICES

Consider why the client population would be seeking the services offered by your program. Where are clients in their current financial lives? How can your volunteer economic opportunity program help them to meet their financial needs? There are tools available in section one of CFED's <u>Building</u> <u>Financial Capability: A Planning Guide for Integrated Services</u> that can help you identify and prioritize the financial needs of your target population.

Volunteers can play a critical role in delivering financial capability services as part of economic opportunity programs. Consider the roles you want volunteers to play based on the services you plan to (or currently) offer for your target population.

Question	Response
What volunteer roles are needed to employ your program (e.g. VITA sites need tax preparers, greeters / screeners, site coordinators, etc.)?	
What skills are needed for each role?	
How and where will you recruit volunteers?	
How many volunteers are needed?	
What is the time commitment expected of volunteers (e.g. one time experience, ongoing, weekly, monthly, etc.)?	
How will volunteers engage with clients (e.g. one-on-one, small groups, large groups, etc.)?	
What training will volunteers need and how will you provide this training?	



The next step is to think through the activities you want your volunteers to perform. One way to do this is by creating job descriptions for each volunteer role in the economic opportunity program. The attached volunteer position description template is available for you to draft your job descriptions. Before you begin your draft, think through the following questions.
