GCMAS Pre-Doctoral Student Travel Scholarship Guidelines

- 1. Eligible students include anyone pre-doctoral and are affiliated with a specific educational/ training program at a public or private education institution. This includes, but is not limited to: Bachelor's, Master's, Pre-DPT, Pre-PhD, and Pre-MD.
- 2. The minimum amount of a student travel award is \$400.00. This award is available to assist students defray their travel costs for attending the annual GCMAS conference.
- 3. A student may receive no more than one (1) travel award total per year. If you have previously received an award, you are still eligible.
- 4. Students agree to attend all days of the conference if awarded.
- 5. Applications not adhering to the procedures/instructions below will not be considered.
- 6. Applications must be received no later than February 15, 2018 at 11:59 PM Central Time.

Scoring

Awards are based on the following criteria:

- 1. Quality of the written statement (50%)
- 2. Presentation at the meeting (20%)
- 3. Letter of recommendation, GPA, etc (30%)

Procedure/Instructions

- 1. Complete the GCMAS Student Travel Award Application form.
- 2. Include a statement (1000 words maximum) describing your specific academic and personal goals related to the GCMAS society and annual conference.
 - a. If you are presenting, please describe how your work fits under the umbrella of GCMAS and what you expect to gain from presenting at the conference.
 - b. If you are not presenting at the conference, you are still eligible to apply. However, we strongly encourage you to clearly describe future work being planned and how you anticipate using the conference experience to aid in planning this future work.
 - c. If you have previously received a travel award from GCMAS, please describe how you have built upon the prior year's award and attendance at the meeting.
- 3. Include a one (1) page maximum letter of support from your primary mentor on institutional letterhead.
- 4. Include all conference abstracts accepted to the program.
