Schedule of Poster Sessions

There are two formal poster sessions:

Session #1 on Wednesday from 4:00 pm - 6:00 pm (posters #101-141)

Session #2 on Thursday from 10:00 am -12:00 pm (posters #201-243)

At least one author must be available to talk with attendees during the assigned poster session.

Please note your poster number as it is the location of your poster display board.

Poster Dimensions

Your poster should be no larger than 4' wide and 4' high (**48 x 48 inches**). Recommended size for a landscape orientation is 4' wide x 3' high.

At least one author must be available to talk with attendees during the assigned poster session. Push-pins will be available at the poster boards. Additional materials will be available at the Registration Desk. All unclaimed posters will be discarded after the conference ends.

Hang posters beginning:	Tues 6/24 3:00pm
Posters must be hung by:	Wed 6/25 10:00am
Posters must hang until:	Thurs 6/26 1:30pm
Posters must be removed by:	Thurs 6/26 3:00pm

We encourage you to hang up posters early to provide the judges with adequate time to evaluate the posters for the GCMAS Best Poster Award

Best Poster Award Finalists
