INDUSTRY PLACEMENTS UPDATE

- We have carried out extensive user centred research and analysis – listening to the sector to understand their concerns
- Significant stakeholder engagement helped us to identify best practice and challenges
- In response to this feedback, we identified a series of additional models and approaches in a policy statement published in May
- This ensures placements are high quality, meaningful, deliverable across different industries and accessible for all students.
- We have also developed a package of further support for employers to support the delivery of industry placements.

T LEVELS FUNDING CONSULTATION

- 150 responses received and workshops held with 2020 providers. The government response will be published later this month (TBC)
- Responses were largely positive with significant support for many of the proposals. Respondents welcomed:
 - the simplicity and continuation of the funding formula
 - funding 18 year olds for T Levels at the same rate as 16 and 17 year olds
 - funding maths and English for those students who need it
 - providing additional disadvantage funding to reflect the extra hours
- There was concern about the levels of funding set out for the T Level bands.
- We are exploring reducing the minimum hours for some of the funding bands and providing additional disadvantage funding for industry placements to better support those with additional needs.
- We are considering the introduction of additional one-off payments per provider for each new T Level introduced in 2020 as well as for those introducing the Transition Framework in 2020. We will also look carefully at 16-19 funding rates as part of our preparations for the next spending review.

COMMS APPROACH

PHASE 1 – FOUNDATION MAY 18-AUG 19

PHASE 2 – TRANSITION PHASE SEPT 2019-2021

- Launch paid for comms activity, with a focus on in Wave 1 areas. Activity ramped up each year as more routes are introduced and expected student numbers rise.
- Key channels targeted paid for advertising, social media, PR, events, stakeholder advocacy,
 2020 provider, Awarding orgs & Careers Adviser channels.

PHASE 3 – TRANSFORMATION PHASE 2021+

- Ahead of full rollout comms will be scaled up to target young people, parents, providers and employers on a national level.
- Key channels national paid for advertising, social media, PR, stakeholder advocacy, 2020 provider, Awarding orgs & Careers Adviser channels.
