BCS Insights 2019... IT Leaders

- **88% of IT leaders said their organisation did not have enough resources for success in 2019**
- Business priorities in 2019
 - Continuous innovation (54%)
 - Operational efficiencies (52%)
 - Business transformation and organisational change (45%) - **singled out by 22% as the number one priority**
- What additional resources are needed to achieve organisational goals
 - Enhance IT capability and skills in the existing workforce
 - Additional IT staff that are suitably qualified
 - Increased budget
 - Enhanced IT capability in IT leadership team

Skills Gaps

- Specific disciplines e.g. data science, cloud, big data, machine learning, agile, cyber security
- Understanding impact of regulatory compliance on the organisation
- How to translate regulatory requirements and apply them pragmatically to internal systems
- A meaningful ability to engage with business users to deliver outcomes they need
