Prague Congress Centre (1 – see map on page 15)

The Prague Congress Centre (PCC) is the largest purpose-built conference facility in the Czech Republic. Situated on a hill on the edge of Prague's historic centre, the venue boasts magnificent views over the city's Old Town and Prague Castle. The PCC first opened in 1981 and is a unique example of Neo-Functionalist architecture. The venue regularly hosts international association congresses, corporate events, and has also hosted a number of top level international summits such as the NATO Council and the Presidency of the European Union. The PCC's co-owner, the City of Prague, has endorsed plans for the refurbishment and construction of additional exhibition space to ensure the venue is at the forefront of developments in the MICE sector, and to maintain and further build upon the PCC's position as one of Europe's most popular venues for larger international conferences and events.



Accommodation

Reservation procedure

Once you have registered for the Congress, you will receive a confirmation email which contains the links to book the official/recommended hotels.

Prague has a wide range of quality accommodation; there are various hotel types available: international chain hotels, independent hotels, boutique hotels or congress hotels. Prague offers over 41,000 rooms, the overall composition is 797 accommodation facilities of 3–5 star hotels and other properties. The majority of the hotels are situated in the city centre which is 25 minutes from the airport.

The two official hotels for the ICCA Congress 2017 are located next to the Congress Centre, within two minutes walking distance. The hotels are above the metro station Vyšehrad (line C) which allows you to get easily to the heart of the city centre, to

the famous Wenceslas Square (5 minutes). Prague has one of the most efficient public transportation systems in Europe.

If you prefer to stay right in the city centre, we recommend you hotels on the metro line only about 5–7 minutes by metro from the Congress Centre. The hotels which are centrally located have many advantages, one of them is the proximity to the famous squares, monuments and historical parts of the city.







with the historic ones. An old factory turned to a unique multi-functional congress venue with great acoustics and modern technical equipment? Yes, it's Forum Karlín - Art Venue in Prague! Steam boilers were manufactured here from 1908 for the whole of the Austria-Hungarian Empire. Today the venue is adorned with an impressive translucent U glass façade with selectable colour lighting. In 2015, Forum Karlín collected the prize for best Czech Music Venue of the Year in the Nouvelle Prague Music Awards. That's where we will enjoy Monday CAT Night.

City tours

Complimentary city tours are offered on the afternoons of Saturday 11 November and Wednesday 15 November. Tours are open to all delegates and accompanying guests free of charge. You can choose between DIY tour (unlimited capacity), guided city tour (limited capacity) and Pilsner Urquell. Registration for all tours is required.

Option A: DIY tour in Prague

Let's discover Prague ourselves with the support of local experts. Find your preferred theme you wish to come alive and follow your way.

Custom designed map will provide you with three thematic trails for your "do it yourself" city tour. Would you like to visit romantic and mysterious places in Prague? Or would you rather experience the cultural heritage and visit the places where artists, musicians, painters created their worldwide famous pieces of work? Last but not least, you have the chance to visit the Jewish Quarter. Come and discover the biggest Jewish ghetto in Europe. On each trail, you will meet visibly marked local experts, who will introduce you the major sights in the area, its history and share with you some interesting facts and stories.

Themes for the DIY tour: Trail 1: Genius Loci – the Old Town and the Jewish Town

Explore the Old Town of Prague and visit the most popular places including the Old Town Square and Astronomical Clock. Learn about the famous legends and symbolic places. A walk through the former Jewish Quarter will give you a taste of its mysterious atmosphere.

Trail 2: Art Nouveau Prague: New Town

See the most spectacular examples of Prague's Art Nouveau architecture and design and find out about the city life at the beginning of the 20th century. Discover the New Town including the Wenceslas Square and Národní třída– symbolic places of the Velvet Revolution – and find out more.

Trail 3: Romantic Prague - Lesser Town and Kampa Island

Cross the most famous bridge in Prague – the Charles Bridge – and discover the romantic places in the Lesser Town and Kampa Island located by the Vltava River. Visit the narrowest street in the city, see the Lennon Wall and take a picture with babies – statues designed by Czech sculptor David Černý.

You can choose one of the tours or you can pass by all points in the map. It is only you, who manages your tour.

Option B: Prague Castle and its surroundings (guided tour)

We will take you by bus to Prague Castle, which has been a symbol of the Czech state for more than a thousand years, as well as the country's most important cultural institution. According to the Guinness Book of World Records, the Prague Castle is the largest enclosed castle complex in the world, covering an area of 70,000 m². The panoramic view of (as well as from) Prague Castle is one of the most spectacular in the world. Prague Castle is also on the UNESCO list of World Cultural and Natural Heritage.

The tour will continue on foot through the Prague Castle area to the St. Vitus Cathedral, the largest and most significant church in the country. In addition to religious services, the coronations of Czech kings and queens also took place here. Did you know that the remains of local patron saints, sovereigns, noblemen and archbishops are deposited here?

Let's discover more of this special monument which the Czechs are proud of.

This tour is recommended for people who are in Prague for the first time or are interested in discovering Prague Castle's district in depth.





Pilsner Urquell - Meet the legend

Are you a beer fan? Would you like to experience a beer which was born in Pilsen (Plzeň)? Beer has been brewed in Plzeň since the late 13th century, but it became renowned worldwide only after the founding of Měšťanský pivovar, today called Pilsner Urquell (Plzeňský Prazdroj in the Czech language). The first batch of beer as we know it today – strong, delicious, bottom-fermented goldencoloured lager with a snow-white frothy head – was brewed on the 5 October 1842. Its fame spread

brewed on the 5 October 1842. Its fame spread quickly and it has inspired more than two-thirds of all beers brewed around the world that are labelled as "Pils".

The success of Pilsen beer rose, the prosperity of the brewery increased, and the Pilsner Urquell brand soon became a synonym for quality worldwide. The fact that Pilsner Urquell soon became an example for all pils, pilsner or pilsener type beers demonstrated this fact. This type of beer makes up 70% of all beer produced worldwide today.

During a guided tour, you will visit the historical and the current brewing facility, the modern bottling plant or historical brewery cellars. All adult visitors aged 18 and over will have an opportunity to taste unfiltered Pilsner Urquell beer tapped directly from oak lager casks.

Geography

The Czech Republic lies in Central Europe and borders with Poland in the northeast, Germany in the west and northwest, with Austria in the south and Slovakia in the east. The Czech Republic covers an area of 78,866 sq. km with a varied terrain of basins, rivers, and mountain ranges. The country has a temperate climate with cool summers and cold and cloudy winters. Prague is the capital city of the Czech Republic spanning 496 sg. km and home to 1, 276 741 inhabitants. Prague is located in the centre of the Czech Republic. The city is truly steeped in a rich cultural history with an architectural heritage reflecting both the uncertain currents of the past and an urban existence extending more than 1,000 years back.

The heart of the city with its historical buildings, bridges, and museums belonging to tourism with many employment possibilities, and around the core, on the peripheries, is a mixed zone of industrial and residential areas.

Getting There

Prague lies in the heart of Europe. Prague International Airport (Václav Havel Airport) operates with the highest standards and the most modern equipment. Prague Airport has 2 conveniently connected international terminals. In 2016, Prague Airport traffic reached more than 13 million passengers. From Prague Airport, passengers can fly to 154 destinations worldwide with 64 scheduled airlines. It is a major hub for Central and Eastern Europe (Czech Republic is an EU and Schengen member).



VISA and Passport Regulations

All participants must have a valid passport and/or an appropriate travel document to enter the Czech Republic.

Please visit the website of the Ministry of the Foreign Affairs of the Czech Republic (www.mzv.cz) to check if you need a visa. Delegates and guests who require a visa can request an invitation letter from ICCA. Please send your passport details to the ICCA Events Department.

Visas are the responsibility of individual delegates and must be obtained before traveling to the Czech Republic. Travellers should check how to obtain a visa at their local Czech embassy or local travel agent.

Transfers & Public transport

Please note that airport transfers are only arranged to/from the official and recommended hotels. These will also have hospitality desks. If you decide to stay in a different hotel, you can take a transfer to one of the recommended hotels which are all centrally located.

Congress participants will receive free Prague public transport passes. The passes are valid in zone P, O and B (including all the congress venues, hotels, etc.) on buses, trams, subway trains, ferries and the Petrin funicular railway.
