UNAIDS recently announced the **90-90-90** goals to end the AIDS epidemic by 2030. Access to quality-assured diagnostics is central to achieving these goals. Presently only 50% of HIV-infected individuals know their status; about 35% of those have access to clinical monitoring tests; and only about 25% have the capability to test for viral load.
