What do we do?

- Assessment and treatment provided for older adults experiencing mental health issues, confusion, cognitive impairment and changes in behaviour
- Services are time limited and include community treatment, assessment, consultation, counselling, advocacy and education
- psycho-educational group for caregivers

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Depression, Dementia and Delirium

- Depression is a mood disorder that causes a persistent feeling of sadness and loss of interest.
- Dementia indicates problems with at least two brain functions, such as memory loss and impaired judgment or language, and the inability to perform some daily activities such as paying bills or becoming lost while driving.
- Delirium is a serious disturbance in mental abilities that results in confused thinking and reduced awareness of your environment. The start of delirium is usually rapid — within hours or a few days.



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Case Scenario

- Woman 85 years old is knocking on doors of residents in your building.
- She is confused and is scared someone is going to hurt her.
- It is 2200h.

- Clients have the right to make choices; whether good or bad

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
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Social Workers

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IDENTIFY NEEDS:

- Know the demographics of your community and the area that you provide service to.
- Are services being offered to meet the diverse ethnicities within the community.
- Conduct a Needs Assessment to determine gaps in service.

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ADRESSING NEEDS:

- Does the agency have the infrastructure to offer
 Ethno specific programs and services?
- How can services be delivered:
 - 1. Partnering with other agencies
 - 2. Recruiting volunteers from community
 - 3. Family members
- Tenants/Clients have access to services that they will benefit from.



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SERVIEE PROVISION TO TENANTS/CLIENTS:

- Programs are culturally sensitive
- Programs are incorporated with agency mandate
- Tenants/Client have equitable access to services
