- 1. Housing Retention
- 2. Housing Placement
- 3. Housing Sustainability





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Alarming Trends...

- High percentage of vulnerable tenants in social housing without the supports they need.
- Social housing providers house clients referred from all sectors such as police, mental health workers, domestic violence agencies, and private rental market.
- Growing number of seniors.
- Long waitlists for mental health supports services including mental health housing.
- High percentage of vulnerable tenants in unaffordable housing.




As A Result....

- The landlord is often the primary access point for connecting the tenant to services and they may not know where to direct them.
- Landlords and other tenants pay the price for unsupported tenancies.
- Higher management costs to the owner increase in complaints from other tenants or neighbors, unit damage, evictions, clutter/hoarding, and after hour emergencies.
- Reduced quality of life for the vulnerable tenant.



What Role Has The Housing Success Team Played???



Housing Retention

- Eviction prevention.
- Advocacy with landlords and local agencies.
- Foster a collaborative approach to stabilize tenancies, secure and maintain sustainable housing.
- Provide ongoing support and follow up.
- Provide a client-centered approach.



The Importance of Housing Retention

Affordable housing provides a more cost-effective solution to addressing homelessness:

- One rent-geared-to-income subsidy = \$613 per month (average)
- One shelter bed = \$2,100 per month (average)
- One long-term care bed = \$3,960 per month (average)
- One correctional facility bed = \$4,300 per month (average)
- One hospital bed = \$13,500 per month (average)

Housing Placement

- Establishing strong relationships with private landlords in the community.
- Assisting with aspects of the housing search for example rental applications, accompaniment to viewing accommodations, guidance with securing financial assistance
- We remove barriers!!!
- Provide a client-centered approach!



Housing Sustainability

- Support landlords and tenants in the community to prevent evictions.
- Connect clients to appropriate services to assist with maintaining ongoing stability.
- Participate in case conferencing and collaborative efforts regarding the client.
- Participate in ongoing follow up visits as needed
- Provide a client-centered approach!





Housing Sustainability is all about everyone working together!

Successes

- Between April 2015 and August 2017 we have assisted approximately 850 clients with housing related issues.
- On average our monthly case load is approximately 50 clients.
- Of the 850 number we have successfully housed 78. This number truly speaks to our focus on housing retention and housing sustainability.
- Successfully created several working relationships with private landlords and social housing providers.
- Successfully connected hundreds of clients to the appropriate services in our district.
