

Cancellation and refund policy

A refund, minus a processing fee of \$75, will be provided for cancellations received in writing no later than October 4, 2019. No refunds will be issued for cancellations made after October 4, 2019. Substitutions are permitted at no cost. All refunds will be issued after the Conference.
