Caught in the housing crunch

As the city pushes forward in its mission to revitalize the world it's more than just a winning town, attracting new and affordable housing opportunities remains a major challenge. While sprawling suburban developments are probably things of the past, city council is currently considering moving applications to turn out-of-use structures into apartment buildings, such as the recently proposed transformation of the old GV hotel on Saginaw.

But for people like Charmaine Desilets, even that isn't

an viable option. Desilets, who lives with her husband Carmine Grondin in a small Schumacher home at 208 Father Corbello Dr., considers herself a "low income" citizen. After going through years of difficulty with their landlord Scotiabank finally foreclosed the house and took over the property, which it will own for 90 days.

The home is currently up for sale by a third-party property management group, leaving Desilets and Grondin desperately seeking for options to re-secure their home. Desilets says they simply can't afford the \$34,000 listed price, but don't

really have anywhere else to go either.

"I don't want to move. There's nothing out there," said an emotional Desilets. "We need looking for places. They're building all kinds of condos, but some of us can't afford them. \$700,000 for an apartment — on the internet in the newspaper, even online, and it's all over \$1,000 (a month). There's nothing out there."

Desilets and Grondin want to make their plight public. She says when it comes to affordable housing, there simply isn't enough of it.

The matter of accessibility only compounds the matter. Desilets says her husband suffers from multiple health ailments, including epilepsy, depression, and schizophrenia. Desilets herself has osteoarthritis in both legs, which makes walking up stairs or for too long a painful challenge and says she can only work part-time.

It's hard enough to find any housing at all, but affordable and accessible to her? Forget about it, says Desilets.

"Right now, we're not being evicted, but what happens if someone dies pay the house and we can't afford to live? What's

going to happen to us? I'm trying to see if there's people out there who can help us."

"The thing is, it's frustrating when landlords own houses, they don't pay their taxes, they don't pay their mortgages, and they don't pay their taxes. And what happens to all the people who are on low income, they tell us to go to the Ministry of Housing (and Municipal Affairs housing assistance program), but the waiting list is so long."

"We can only afford \$800, max \$850 a month, with everything included," she said. "It's definitely like to see more affordable housing available. We need it."

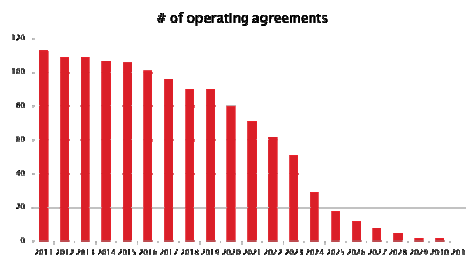


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NUMBER 9 – BLEAK FUTURE
