# **Full-day courses**

#### F1 RGI: Do your calcs add up?

Take your number crunching to the next level! Designed for experienced RGI administrators, this intensive course will help you navigate tricky calculations. Bring challenging calcs that you've encountered to this interactive and practical workshop. We'll cover the variables and formulas used to calculate rent-geared-to-income under the *Housing Services Act* using a series of case studies.

Learn how to:

- verify different sources of income, including what income is included and excluded from RGI calculations
- handle retroactive lump-sum payments and tenant incomes that fluctuate
- apply utility charges and allowances

### F2 The fundamentals of affordable housing

A successful career in housing requires a strong foundation. This course will introduce participants to Ontario's affordable housing sector and help them understand the fundamentals of housing policy in Canada.

Participants will leave knowing:

- the rationale for housing policy
- the non-housing outcomes of housing policy
- how housing policy, programs and institutional arrangements have changed
- the constitutional context and evolving role of governments
- policy and program alternatives used in Canada and their outcomes
- how to develop and measure outcomes of housing strategies

#### F3 Getting it write: Notices of termination at the Landlord and Tenant Board

Evictions are one of the toughest parts of a landlord's job, but it is crucial to master the process. Avoid delays and frustration by gaining a full understanding of how the Landlord and Tenant Board (LTB) operates. Join *Residential Tenancies Act* (RTA) expert Laura Clark as she walks you through the different notices of termination and the process at the LTB.

Participants will leave with:

- a better understanding of the RTA and your role as a landlord
- the knowledge of when to use each notice and how to complete them correctly
- strategies for resolving a dispute and avoiding a hearing
- tips on how to prepare for a hearing

#### F4 Fire safety: Are you up-to-date on regulations?

With fire regulations in Ontario constantly changing, it can be tough to keep up. Get the latest scoop on fire safety from James Hind, a fire prevention expert for the City of London. He'll share the most current information on the Ontario *Fire Code* and essential fire safety practices.

James will cover:

- responsibilities of a landlord/superintendent as described in the *Fire Code*
- how to make sense of the legislation and which sections are the most important
- what's new in the Fire Code, including carbon monoxide detection
- vulnerable occupancies and care occupancies
- fire prevention in your buildings

#### F5 FISH! Lessons in customer service

#### **H1** Financial management for board members

As a member of the board, your primary responsibility is to ensure the financial health of your organization. Hone your skills with this hands-on workshop on board essentials.

We'll share best practices and practical information on:

- the principles of financial stewardship and the financial cycle for non-profit housing providers
- roles and responsibilities of a board and staff with respect to sound financial management
- the budgeting process
- reviewing financial statements to get the information you need to make good decisions
- implementing financial policies and internal controls to ensure compliance in your operations

#### H2 Operating agreements are ending: What's next?

- how to identify strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats using a SWOT analysis
- how to determine the skills a board needs to move forward
- how to identify next steps
