Abstract:

Within Mississauga an enviable partnership has developed that includes the municipal government (City of Mississauga Mayor's Office and Economic Development Office), the post-secondary institutions (U of T Mississauga and Sheridan College), The Regional Innovation Centre (Research Innovation and Commercialization (RIC) Centre) and our numerous industry partners.
