Since Thailand has been in the mourning period, the appropriate dress code is black conservative dress. Specifically, if you go to the grand palace, it is mandatory that you must dress according to grand palace rules.

The dress code for the IAU-Spouse program is restricted to the formal dress for funeral ceremony because the palace that we will visit is the royal temples. (Temple of Emerald Buddha, Temple of the Reclining Buddha, and the Marble temple)



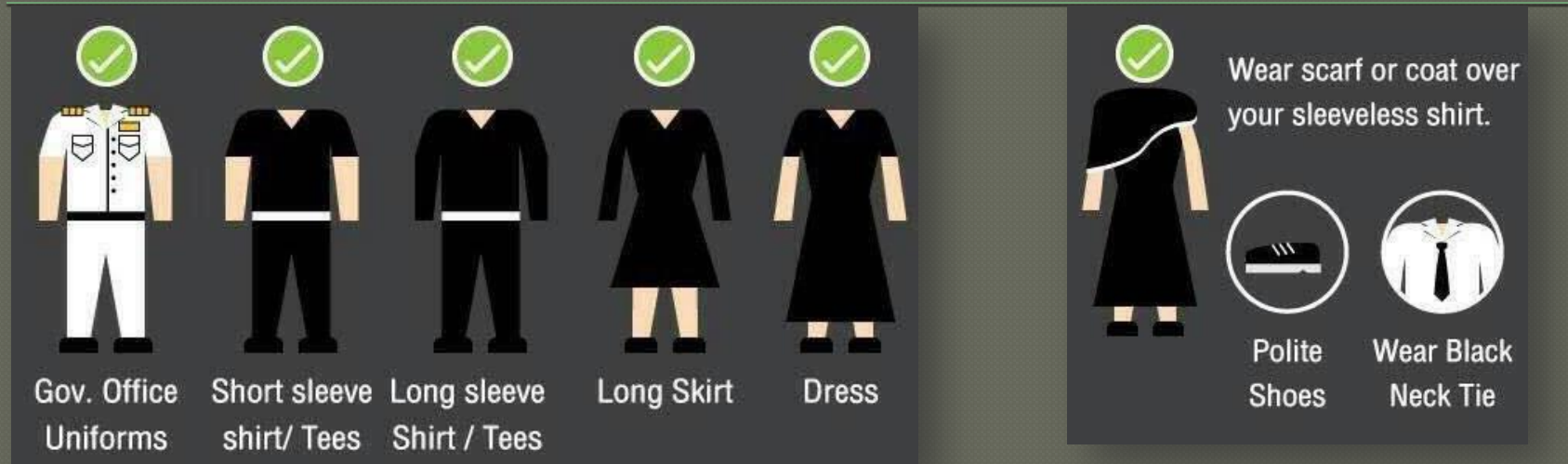
The officials of the grand palace reserve the right to refuse entry of any delegates who don't dress in conservative funeral dress code.

- **Male** : Black long-sleeve shirt with collar, long dark colored trousers, and covered black footwear.
- **Female** : Black blouse that covers the shoulders, long dark colored skirt or black dress that below the knees, stockings, and covered black footwear.

Don't

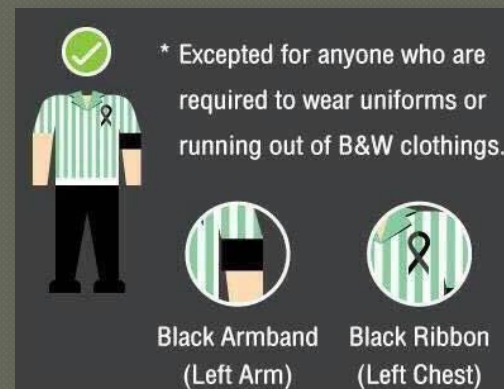
No denim are allowed.
