What is Single Touch Payroll?





Single Touch Payroll (STP)

- New way for employers to report YTD wages, PAYGW and Super to the ATO.
- Instead of waiting until the end of the financial year, employee payroll information is reported YTD every time they get paid.




Steps you need to take to be STP ready!

- Embrace digital processes
- Talk to your staff
- Communicate the changes
- Apply for more time if you need it (deferral)
- Determine who will authorise
- Determine who will lodge
- Talk to your Tax/BAS Agent

- Streamline other parts of the business








How will STP save you time and keep you compliant

1 in 5 SMES still use pen & paper to record wages

How will STP be of benefit to my employees?

Employee benefits

- Access all of their employer & tax withholding in one place in myGov account
- Can check if their super has been paid
- They can be confident that their employer is meeting all their obligations




What is myGov?



How does myGov work?

myGov is a secure way to access government services online with one login and one password.



Are there any exemptions to being STP compliant for small business?

Exemptionsclosely held payees

- No need to report in 2019-20 financial year.
- Payment summary still issued.
- From 1 July 2020 you will have to start reporting quarterly making reasonable estimates.



Exemptions (concession) micro employers

- Those who rely on a registered agent can apply quarterly for the first 2 years, rather than each pay event.
- No penalties for mistakes, missed or late reports in the first year



Exemptions – other

 ATO will allow employers who are experiencing hardship or no internet connection exemptions from STP



Understanding your Reporting Obligations to the ATO

How and what is reported

 Pay events are reported to the ATO on or before the pay day

 YTD values of gross wages, allowances, deductions, PAYGW and super information is reported in every payroll event via your software.



What about super

 ATO will compare the super amounts reported with the information they receive from the funds.

 Ensure all super details are correct & updated in your software



Employment details updated


- You must record employee start dates and termination dates on or before the pay date in your payroll software.
- TFN declarations in QuickBooks Online can be reported via a pay event


Select a Role – Employer or Tax Agent






Key Pay Payroll Settings

Contact the ATO with your Software ID Number if you are not using a Registered Tax or BAS Agent to process your payroll or lodge your BAS


Easily opt-in to STP within ATO Supplier settings


