

The Federal Highway Administration:


- Improves Mobility on the Nation's highways through National Leadership, Innovation and Program Delivery
- Coordinate the delivery of highway transportation programs in cooperation with states and other partners in a manner that enhances safety, economic vitality, quality of life, and the environment.


Federal Highway Administration

- Federal-aid Highway Program
 - Provides Federal Financial and Technical Assistance to State and Local Governments for Constructing, Preserving, and Improving the Nation's Transportation System
- Federal Lands Highway Program
 - Provides Funding for Public Roads and Highways within Federally Owned Lands and Tribal Lands that are not a State or Local Government Responsibility



FHWA also manages a comprehensive research, development, and technology program







Brownfields in Transportation


- The FHWA will provide support that encourages appropriate transportation ACCESS for Brownfields redevelopment
- The FHWA will seek to ensure that brownfields redevelopment is appropriately considered in state and metropolitan planning processes










- The Federal-aid Highway Program relies on a federal-state partnership.
- States or local agencies initiate all projects and decide where to use Federal-aid funds.
- Most funds are available only for improvements on the "Federal-aid highway system."
