This international 'gold standard' will provide institutions with an evaluative and critical framework for engagement and a coherent focus for action, enabling them to demonstrate realities of engagement 'on the ground' in their respective universities that can then be managed and developed.

Can we measure university engagement? - This session will give insight into a new Nous Group Project, led by the University of Melbourne, University of Chicago, and King's College London, which is looking at global incentives for institutional engagement and the intricacies of making engagement truly global and measuring it.
