





The City



LONDON



London is the capital of England and largest city in the United Kingdom, Home to 8.7 million people and hosting 31.5 million tourists each year, London is a world-leading global historical, cultural and financial city.

The city is located in the south east of the island of Great Britain, on the banks of the River Thames. The 2,000-year-old river harbours much of London's history, as well as providing a backdrop to many of the city's most iconic sites such as the London Eye, Tower of London and the Houses of Parliament.



London is home to numerous tourist attractions, including four World Heritage Sites, eight Royal Parks, 170 museums which are free of charge to enter and 230 theatres. The capital is renowned for shopping from food markets to luxury department stores.

Her Majesty's Prison and Probation Service (HMPPS)

Her Majesty's Prison and Probation Service (HMPPS) is an Executive Agency of the Ministry of Justice (MoJ). Our role is to commission, provide and regulate the delivery of offender management services in the community and in custody ensuring best value for money from public resources. We work to protect the public and reduce reoffending by delivering the punishment and orders of the courts and supporting rehabilitation by helping offenders to reform their lives.



HM Prison &
Probation Service

We deliver our offender services through:

1

Responsible in the community for carrying out risk assessments of all offenders and for the direct management of those offenders who pose the highest risk of serious harm to the public and who have committed the most serious offences

2

Public Sector Prisons – 107 prisons which provide around 82 percent of prison places

3

21 Community Rehabilitation Companies (CRCs), contracted with private providers – responsible for delivering community requirements for medium and low risk offenders

4

Private sector providers – operating 14 prisons under contract with private providers delivering other significant services including prisoner escorts and electronic monitoring of offenders

5

Partnerships – with a range of public and third sector partners, including police, local authorities, health and education providers, and with a wide range of organisations in the voluntary and social enterprise sector

6

The agency is also contracted by the Youth Justice Board to provide commissioned places for young people (under 18) and by the Home Office to provide places at Immigration Removal Centres and detention spaces in prisons.

Our headquarters functions provide corporate and operational support services for the Agency and undertake the work required to meet our responsibilities to Parliament.

VISA

CURRENCY

The currency in the United Kingdom is the pound sterling (£ / GBP). There are 100 pence (p) to the pound (£). Notes come in denominations of £5, £10, £20 and £50. Coins come in 1p, 2p, 5p, 10p, 20p, 50p, £1 and £2.



FOREIGN EXCHANGE

Foreign currencies and travellers cheques can be exchanged at bureaux de change – often located inside banks, travel agents or Post Offices, as well as at London's airports and major train stations.



CREDIT CARDS AND CASH MACHINES IN LONDON

Credit cards – especially Visa and Mastercard – are widely accepted in London's restaurants, bars, cafés and shops. American Express and Diners Club cards are less commonly accepted. There are plenty of cash machines/ATMs around London. Most accept international cards with the Visa, Plus, Mastercard, Cirrus or Maestro symbols.



VALUE ADDED TAX (VAT)

Value added tax at 20% is added to goods and services in the UK.

You can sometimes get VAT refunds on goods bought in the UK. For information on whether you are eligible and how to apply for a refund, visit:

The Hotel Novotel London West

The Novotel London West is situated near the shopping area of Kensington and the famous Hammersmith Apollo Theatre. The hotel has easy access to the London Underground and road networks.

Transport to the Venue

TRAVEL FROM HEATHROW (LHR) TO THE VENUE

Heathrow airport is approximately 11 miles from Hammersmith. The airport has 5 terminals.

Public transport

If you are arriving at Terminals 1, 2 or 3 connect to the London Underground and take the Piccadilly line eastbound for 10 stops to Hammersmith. Journey time approximately 30 minutes. If you are arriving at Terminals 4 or 5 connect to the London Underground and take the Piccadilly line eastbound for 11 stops to Hammersmith. Journey time approximately 45 minutes.


Taxi

There are taxi ranks outside each Heathrow terminal and you can hail a taxi upon arrival. Alternatively, you can book a private hire taxi from the airport – for more information visit <http://www.heathrow.com/transport-and-directions/journey-planner/my-journey-plan?mode=taxi> Journey time approximately 30 minutes, cost approximately £30

London's black taxis stop at the ranks outside each Heathrow terminal. All drivers are fully licensed and have passed the Knowledge of London examination.

TRAVEL FROM LONDON CITY (LCY) TO THE VENUE

London City Airport is in London Underground zone 3 and is connected to the Docklands Light Railway (DLR). The DLR departs London City Airport every 8 to 15 minutes. From the airport, take the DLR westbound (towards Bank) for 3 stops to Canning Town. At Canning Town, connect to the Jubilee line westbound for 9 stops to Green Park, change for the Piccadilly line westbound 7 stops to Hammersmith.



TRAVEL FROM LONDON GATWICK (LGW) TO THE VENUE

The Gatwick Express is the fastest way to travel to and from the airport and Central London. Trains leave every 15 minutes, seven days a week and it takes 30 minutes to travel from the airport to Victoria station. You can book tickets in advance at www.gatwickexpress.com or purchase from a kiosk at Gatwick station. Prices from £17.80 each way. Upon arrival at Victoria station, you can connect to the London underground network, or complete the journey by taxi.

Victoria station is on the Victoria, Circle and District Underground lines. To connect to the venue from Victoria station, take the District line westbound for 7 stops to Hammersmith.

TRAVEL FROM LONDON LUTON (LTN) TO THE VENUE

It will take approximately 90 minutes to transfer from Luton airport. Upon arrival at Luton, take the free shuttle bus to Luton Airport Parkway station (transfer time approximately 7 minutes). From Luton Airport Parkway, there are frequent services to St Pancras International station that take approximately 30 minutes. Upon arrival at St Pancras International station, you can connect to the London underground network at Kings Cross St Pancras, or complete the journey by taxi.

Kings Cross St Pancras station is on the Piccadilly, Northern, Victoria, Circle, Metropolitan and Hammersmith & City Underground lines. To connect to the venue from Kings Cross St Pancras, take the Piccadilly line westbound for 13 stops to Hammersmith.

TRAVEL FROM LONDON STANSTED (STN) TO THE VENUE

Stansted Express is the fastest and most direct way to travel from Stansted Airport to Central London. Trains run every 15 minutes, seven days a week and it takes 47 minutes to travel from the airport to Liverpool Street Station. You can book tickets in advance at www.stanstedexpress.com or purchase from a kiosk at Stansted station. Prices vary from £8 – 19 each way. Upon arrival at Liverpool Street station, you can connect to the London underground network, or complete the journey by taxi.

Liverpool Street Station is on the Central, Metropolitan and Hammersmith & City Underground lines. To connect to the venue from Liverpool Street Station, take the Central line westbound for 4 stops to Holborn and change for the Piccadilly line westbound for 11 stops to Hammersmith.
