NEIGHBORHOOD REVITALIZATION



Welford Sanders was a man with a passion for helping his community grow, and he used that drive to not only build up the city of Milwaukee, but also inspire many before his untimely death in May of 2015.

Since 2001, Welford served as the executive director for the Martin Luther King Economic Development Corporation developing and co-developing nearly \$45 million of real estate. These developments included a restaurant and four mixed-use properties, which to this day offer affordable housing and commercial space for growing businesses. In recent years, Sanders developed commercial space that houses a cafe and fresh food market operated by Growing Power and began construction of a commercial kitchen for local caterers and other food-related small business startups.

As if he wasn't busy enough, Welford was an assistant adjunct professor in the School of Architecture and Urban Planning at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee (UWM) where he specialized in urban development, neighborhood planning and housing. During his tenure at UWM, he also managed the Kellogg Foundation's Urban Food System Initiative.

Mr. Sanders was a champion for small business, nurtured countless entrepreneurs and served as a near-founding member of the Growing Power board.

At the time of his passing, Welford was board chair.

Welford received a Master of Science in Urban and Regional Planning and an undergraduate degree from the University of Wisconsin-Madison (UW). During his time at UW, he became its first African-American fencing student-athlete, going on to win three varsity letters as a Badger in the 1960s.

In 1979, Mr. Sanders was a senior research associate with the American Planning Association (APA) in Chicago and was the associate director of research for APA from 1988 - 1990. He served as a principal investigator for several of APA's nationwide studies, including a HUD-funded project that examined reforms in local development standards that allow for affordable housing. Sanders authored and co-authored a series of reports on zoning innovations for new residential development, and served on numerous local and national panels and task forces. He was a nationally recognized authority on development controls for factory-built housing, having researched and written extensively on the subject.

Welford served as a consultant to both local governments and the private sector, including community-based development agencies, and was involved in a number of neighborhood revitalization projects. He had extensive background in land development and was especially knowledgeable of development standards and regulatory techniques that allow for more affordable housing.

From 1990 – 1993, Sanders was the director of program development for the Social Development Commission in Milwaukee. He managed the acquisition of new properties, expansion of existing facilities, and the development and management of new program initiatives in housing and community revitalization, including development of the agency's food preparation facility.

Welford freely shared his extensive knowledge in land development and regulatory techniques and mentored extensively. His impact on countless students, partners and colleagues will ensure that his legacy of affordable housing shall continue, while encouraging more innovation and growth in Milwaukee.
