If a longer abstract is submitted, the extra pages will be discarded and only the first page will be submitted to the scientific committee for review. All abstracts will be reviewed by at least two reviewers.

In terms of contents, the abstract should contain a *Title-Authors-Affi liation* section in the form and style defined by this template, then a section entitled *I ntroduction* as described above, followed by any number of *main sections*, and ending with two sections entitled *Conclusion* and *References*. Besides these few rules, no further restrictions apply.




Figure 1: Perhaps you want the caption to the right of the figure, then follow the setup de-fined here. Note that the font size of the caption is 10 pt, which is smaller than the 11 pt of the main text. (a) Description of the first sub-figure. (b) The next sub-figure. (c) The third sub-figure. (d) Last but not least, the fourth sub-figure.
