Poster presentations are invited dealing with any aspect of the Human-Animal Interaction.

1. Submit abstracts by e-mail to Sylvie Cloutier (scloutie@vetmed.wsu.edu) **no later than September 23, 2013**. The e-mail subject heading must read "BUSTAD SYMPOSIUM ABSTRACT".
2. Notification of acceptance will be sent out no later than September 30, 2013.
3. Abstracts should consist of the title, names of authors (including first names, not just initials) and their institutional addresses (including e-mail), and the main body of the text. The main body should be single spaced, in a single paragraph, and no more than **300 words**. Use the Times New Roman font, 12 point size. Abstracts must contain a clear statement of the purpose of the work, the methods used (including the number of animals or experimental units), the results obtained, and conclusions. Results should be presented in sufficient detail to support the conclusions drawn. Except for theoretical contributions and review papers, submitted abstracts must contain data, indicate the method(s) of analysis, and provide information about statistical significance. References, tables or figures should not be included. Abstracts must be submitted in Microsoft Word format and the file should be named "BUSTAD Abstract YOUR SURNAME.doc".

Guidelines for Poster Presentations

1. The poster sessions will take place in the second floor atrium of the CUE building.
2. Poster set up will occur between 7.00-8.00 h on Saturday October 19th. Supplies will be available to set up posters on the boards. Check at the registration table for your space assignment. Posters should be left up for the duration of the meeting.
3. Each presenting author is expected to be present at your poster for discussion with viewers at the following scheduled time Saturday October 19th 10.00-10.30 h.
4. Prompt take down of the posters at the end of the meeting on Sunday afternoon will be appreciated. The organizing committee is not responsible for the return of any unclaimed posters. Please do not remove your poster before 15.00h on Saturday. Premature takedown of posters will limit the opportunity for meeting participants to view the material and detract from this portion of the program.
5. You are encouraged to provide copies of a single sheet handout containing pertinent information from your poster for observers. Handouts should be clearly marked with your poster title, authors, affiliation, and contact information (e.g. email address or a URL). An envelope will be provided for handouts.
6. Recommended poster dimensions are **4 ' wide by 3.5 ' high** (maximum).
7. When preparing your poster, make all text large enough to read easily from a distance of 6'. Aim to minimize text and maximize presentation of concepts and data in pictorial form (e.g., graphs, flowcharts, drawings, diagrams, photographs).
