ELK CITY — An \$2.2 million infusion into this farwestern Oklahoma town will structurally improve an industrial park and bring jobs to an area hurl by the freefalling economy. The Economic Develop-

ment Administration recovery grant for the Becknam County community is one of the first to be announced, said Bryan Borik, a public affairs spokesnam with the U.S. Commerce Department. The grant is for storm water trainage and infrastrucure improvement at the Ellis of the properties of the pro-
