CHSP Overview

- Consolidation of HACC, NRCP, DTC and ACHA
- Retention of block (output) funding most contracts to 30 June 2018
- Entry level program limit of service to less than Home Care Package
- Grandfathering of existing clients (still not clear for HCP clients)
- Guidelines and Manual will be complemented by series of Fact Sheets
- \$20 million in transition support funding for CHSP providers to assist with implementing the new programme
- ► Transitioning to CHSP 'Timeline for service providers' is valuable

Manual & Guidelines

- Separation of assessment and service provision MAC/RAS
- Wellness, Re-ablement & Restorative Approach
 - DSS intends to source a change management organisation to assist with implementing a wellness approach in the CHSP
 - Process around re-ablement services not clear yet
- New restrictions on some services, e.g.
 - \$500 (max \$1,000) for equipment \$10,000 for home modification
- Flexibility of up to 20% of outputs within sub-programmes
 - Community & Home Support Care Relationships

 - Assistance with Care & Housing
 - Service System Development
- Specialised Support services new service type
- Sector Support to continue until 2017 ©

CHSP Fees

- National Fees/Client contribution framework principles (soon?)
- Each organisation to develop a policy
- Simple means test and hardship provisions by provider
- ▶ No mandatory fees schedule target of 15% of grant revenue
- Greater transparency of user charges
- Gradual move to national consistency
- Money goes back into service provision
- Monitored via reporting & quality review

August – November 2015

- Transition funds
 - formula for allocation and letters early 2015-16
- New CHSP Contracts 1 Nov 2015
 - discussions commence August 2015
- DSS Data Exchange 1 Nov 2015
 - technical specifications August 2015
 - information and training to commence soon

HOME CARE PACKAGES



Current Reforms

- ► 4 levels of Home Care Package
 - Dementia & Cognition Supplement
 - Veterans Supplement
- Basic Daily Fee
 - Up to 17.5 % of pension = \$9.77 per day
- ►Income tested fees
 - Income testing via Department of Human Services
 - Annual cap of up to \$10,000
 - Lifetime cap of \$60,000
- **▶** Consumer Directed Care (CDC)
 - All existing HCPs became CDC from 1 July 2015
 - Transition for clients with services above HCP level

Implications for HCP providers

- Transitioning all clients to CDC
- Low take up of Level 1 & 2 packages in some areas
- Medicare payment issues new on-line claiming now available
- Income testing advice issues errors
- Guidelines / Operational Manual (Guide to Aged Care Law)
- Still no HCP Evaluation Report
- ACAR August 2015 last one

Transition to CDC

- Embedding CDC in the User Rights Principles
- New Charter of Rights & Responsibilities
- Mixed messages fees vs CDC
- Need to focus on CDC philosophy as well as \$
- Loss of pooled funding
- CDC Transition Hotline

February 2017

- Home Care Packages funding transfers to the consumer (Increasing Choice Budget measure)
- No more allocated HCPs to approved providers
- Consumers will choose provider, who then claims funding from government
- Packages will be portable to another provider, including in another location
- Cashed out model not part of stage 1
- Policy aim increased competition leading to enhanced quality
 & innovation

2016 – 2018 Full rollout of NDIS

- Need to plan now for loss of block funding for CCSP and disability programs

August 2017

- Final report on Review of LLLB Reforms

 July 2018
- Amalgamation of CHSP and HCP into a single program – Integrated Care at Home Program
