Starting at the National Park Service Museum and Visitor Center, you will explore the Gettysburg Museum of the Civil War, watch the acclaimed short film “A New Birth of Freedom,” and visit the world-famous Gettysburg Cyclorama, the fully-restored 360° cylindrical painting depicting “Pickett’s Charge”. After lunch on your own at the on-site restaurant, we will finish the day with an educational, two-hour, licensed, guided bus tour of this hallowed ground. The bus departs the Lodge at 9 a.m. and will return by 4:30 p.m.




### Still-Life Painting Class • Hershey Lodge • 9 to 11 a.m. • \$30
