## Eric J. Wenger, P.E. Director Public Works/City Engineer The City of Oklahoma City

Eric Wenger began his career with the City of Oklahoma City in 1994 after the passage of the City's original MAPS (Metropolitan Area Projects) initiative. He served as project manager for two of the nine projects, managing the planning, design and construction of the \$34 million Bricktown Ballpark and the \$88 million Oklahoma City Arena.

When MAPS for Kids passed in 2001, Eric was appointed to manage the \$700 million school reconstruction initiative. The program includes over one hundred construction, transportation and technology projects – all benefiting Oklahoma City's public school students.

Eric's responsibilities grew exponentially when MAPS 3 passed in 2009, and was appointed to manage the \$777 million program. MAPS 3 includes the design and construction of eight projects - a downtown central park; a new downtown convention center; a modern streetcar system; improvements to the Oklahoma River; improvements to the Oklahoma State Fairgrounds; senior wellness centers; additional trails and sidewalks throughout the City.

In August 2011, Eric was appointed as the Director of Public Works and City Engineer. The Public Works department maintains the City's infrastructure, streets, bridges, drainage and traffic control facilities; and works with engineers and contractors on capital improvement projects.

Eric graduated from the University of Oklahoma in 1994 with a civil engineering degree. He is a registered professional engineer, is married and has two school-aged children.
