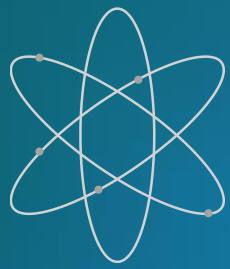

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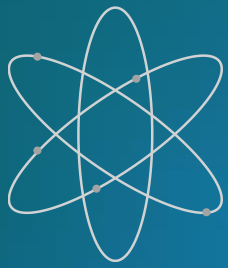
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# NRC Activities Impacting EQ

## Part 21

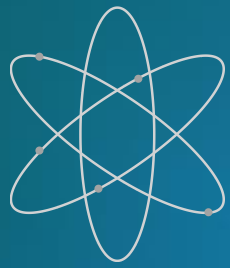
- Industry/NEI, Interested Parties: Ongoing interface with NRC Related to Part 21
  - Part 21 interpretation issues
  - Rulemaking versus guidance issues
- Benefit to utilities, including EQ, procurement groups, from clarifications of guidance with respect to, for example:
  - Vendor understanding of obligations
  - Related clarification of good practices in contracts



# NRC Activities Impacting EQ

## Part 21

- Industry Guidance - NEI 14-09, “Guidelines for Implementation of 10 CFR Part 21 Reporting of Defects and Noncompliances”
- Draft Revision 1 in preparation, meeting later this week
- Dialogue Regarding NRC Comments for additional clarification, including:
  - More guidance for vendors, suppliers and sub-suppliers
  - Overseas suppliers/Part 21 responsibility transfer to purchasers
  - Supply of safety-related hardware
  - Contractual reminders of Part 21 applicability
  - Records retention
  - “Failure to comply” clarification
