POWER = CONTROL?

A more desirable model is rooted in social intelligence, responsibility and cooperation.

For educators, power can be elusive and enigmatic. Knowing more about power as positive influence and how to use that in acceptable and appropriate ways is a wonderful resource to enhance and enrich a teacher's or administrator's role in schools, and beyond.

- ⇒ How can we promote the responsible use of power to advance peaceful and safe "playgrounds" and societies built on cooperation and trust?
