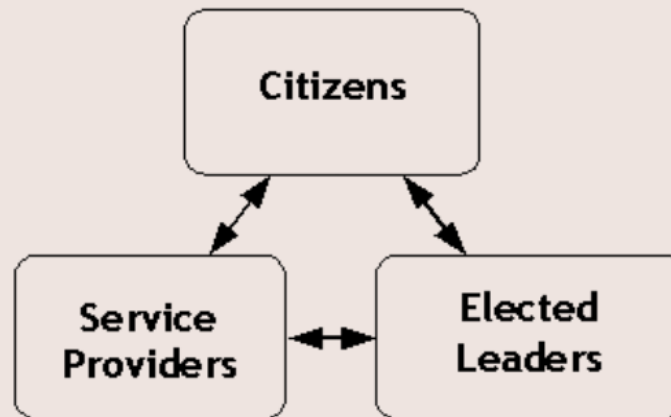

Cambodia (6%)

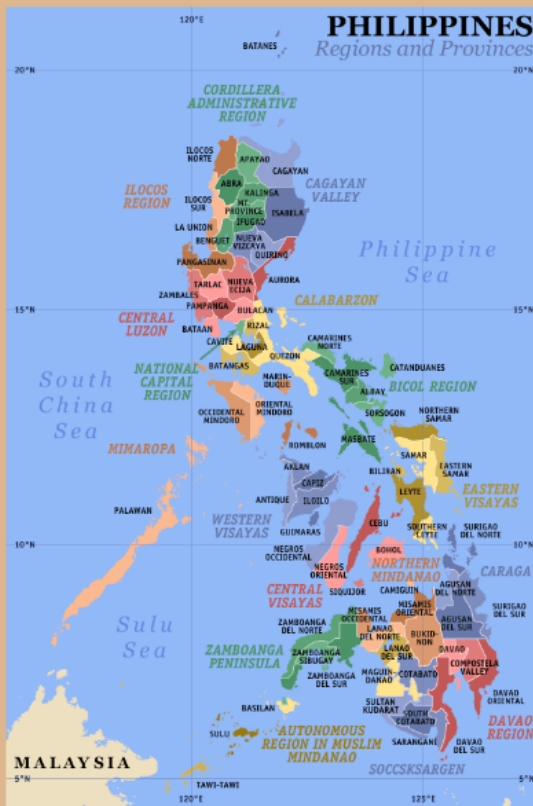
