The following directions will take you to the town centre car parks:

If you are travelling north to Kilmarnock:

Take the A77 north from Ayr and take the off ramp to Kilmarnock B7082 Grassyards interchange. Turn left at the top of the ramp onto Grassyards Road. Turn right at first roundabout onto Strawberrybank Road. Continue straight through first set of traffic signals. After the second set of traffic signals turn right onto James Shaw Crescent.

If you are travelling east to Kilmarnock:

Take the A71 Hurlford Road from Irvine to Kilmarnock. At the Moorfield Roundabout turn left onto the B7064 (Premier Inn), at second roundabout turn right onto the B7081 Irvine Road and continue straight onto Portland road. Keep left and turn onto John Finnie Street A735 and follow the one way system through the town centre until you reach the public car parks.

If you are travelling south to Kilmarnock:

Take the M77/A77 south from Glasgow and leave at junction signposted Kilmarnock B7082 Grassyards Interchange. Turn right at the top of the ramp onto Grassyards Road. Turn right at first roundabout onto Strawberrybank Road. Continue straight through first set of traffic signals. After second set of traffic signals turn right onto James Shaw Crescent.

A = East George Street Car Park
