It was the first time Australia had joined in the global event which originated in the United Kingdom and has now stretched to South Africa and Europe. "We know aged care is dear to the hearts of those who work in the sector and those whose families receive services," Professor Kelly.

"Australia's ageing population is increasing and there will be more demand for services into the future.

"Most Australians have a preference to age at home but residential care is often the best option for those with complex care needs. Retirement villages or supported living are growing in popularity for those who are well but want to downsize from the family home.

"By opening the doors to these providers, people can see what is available and be better informed if and when they need to make a choice about care for themselves or family members."
